Personal Terrarium

Most people don't realize how easy it is to have a personal terrarium. We've had one for several years sitting on our windowsill and we've only had to water it twice in all that time. You can make your own today!

What You'll Need

- Large glass container with lid
- Gravel
- Carbon (you can buy small amounts like for aquarium filters)
- Dirt
- Plants (small, slow-growing is best)
- Water

What You'll Do

- 1. Place a layer of gravel, carbon and dirt (see image) in the glass container.
- 2. Place your plant inside.
- Add a little water and put the cap on tightly.
- 4. Place your terrarium in a sunny spot where it can stay and be undisturbed for months or years. Watch it closely each day for about a week.
- 5. When it looks too foggy inside, open the lid for fifteen minutes. If too dry, water just a few drops and close it again.

It only takes a few days for the inner climate to adjust and then you won't have to touch it again for months or perhaps even years. Just enjoy it and watch it grow!

- Optional: glitter or lace doilies




What You'll Do

- 2. Fold it in half again to form a card.
- 3. Decorate the card any way you like with crayons, glue, or glitter. Another option is to use lace doilies to form shapes or use it as edging.
- **4.** Glue a button onto the front of the card. Glue another on the back of the card.
- 5. Cut a piece of yarn about 3-inches long. Gently wrap an end around beach button.

Now the person to whom you give your card has to unwrap the yarn, just like unwrapping a gift!




