
How Christ Used the Hebrew Scriptures

Jesus: The THEME of the OLD TESTAMENT


The storyline of the Bible can be summarized as the redemption of God's creation—especially humanity. In Genesis paradise is lost, and in Revelation it is regained. Because God the Son in the person of Jesus Christ brings about this redemption, Jesus is the main theme of the Old Testament. Many Old Testament passages predict a Messiah ("anointed one") who would reign over all creation in peace and righteousness. But he would also have to suffer sacrificially for the redemption of others, die, and rise again (Ps. 2; Isa. 9:6; 53).

Jesus was fully aware of his messianic identity and said that the Scriptures made predictions about his life, especially his sacrificial death:

- Addressing the Jewish religious leaders, Jesus explained, "You study the Scriptures diligently because you think that in them you have eternal life. These are the very Scriptures that testify about me" (John 5:39).
- Speaking to his disciples, he said, "Everything that is written by the prophets about the Son of Man will be fulfilled" (Luke 18:31).
- On the road to Emmaus, the risen Jesus explained to two disciples in great detail "what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself" (Luke 24:27).
- Following his resurrection, Jesus referred to the three major divisions of the Hebrew Bible as pointing toward him: "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms" (Luke 24:44).



"One nation was being crushed by another and one city by another, because God was troubling them with every kind of distress." 2 CHRON. 15:6 (ISA. 19:2)
6	Jesus said that a sign of his second coming will be "the abomination that causes desolation" standing in the holy place. MATT. 24:15; MARK 13:14	"At the temple he will set up an abomination that causes desolation, until the end that is decreed is poured out on him." DAN. 9:27; 11:31
7	Jesus told his disciples that he must be "numbered with the transgressors" to fulfill prophecy. LUKE 22:37	"And [he] was numbered with the transgressors." ISA. 53:12
8	Jesus quoted Psalm 41:9 to say that someone close to him would betray him. JOHN 13:18	This verse describes David's betrayal by a close friend who "shared [his] bread." PS. 41:9




