

WHAT YOU NEED

- page 10, duplicated on card stock
- paper towel tubes
- yarn
- scissors





- glue
- crayons



BEFORE CLASS

Duplicate a pattern page for each child. Make a sample craft of a mobile to show the children.



WHAT TO DO

- 1. Introduce the lesson by telling the story from Genesis 6:5-7:24. Ask, What did God tell Noah to do? What did Noah do? Say, No one had ever seen an ark before. Noah built an ark because God told him to do it.
- 2. Show the sample craft.
- 3. Distribute a pattern page to each child.
- 4. Say the memory verse.
- 5. Have the children cut out and color the mobile pieces and memory verse. Help them punch holes in the top of each piece, string yarn through each hole, then loop and tie the yarn around the tube, arranging the pictures in the correct order. Say, God asked Noah to do things he had never done before. Noah did them because he believed God would keep His promises.




EXTRA TIME

Before the children make the craft, review the story by having the children place the story pieces in chronological order. Play a game by giving a set of story pieces to each of several small groups and time who can place them in the correct order first.

BEFORE CLASS

Duplicate a pattern page for each child.



WHAT TO DO

- 1. Introduce the lesson by telling the story from Exodus 3:1-4:12. Say, God had a very important job for Moses that Moses didn't think he could do. God told Moses He would be with Moses and help him do this important job.
- 2. Distribute a pattern page to each child.
- 3. Say the memory verse.
- 4. Say, Newspapers list jobs in a section called "want ads." Let's read a want ad God might have put in a paper for finding someone to lead the people out of Egypt. Ask an older reader to read the top section.
- 5. Tell kids to write a want ad for a job they could do for God.



EXTRA TIME

Create a job bulletin board of jobs kids can do to help others or help the church. Title a poster board, "Jobs For Jesus." Brainstorm job ideas with your group. Distribute index cards and pencils, asking kids to write a job on an index card then tape it to a poster board.



- page 10, duplicated
- pencils



BEFORE CLASS

Duplicate the pattern page for each child.





WHAT TO DO

- 1. Introduce the lesson by telling the story from Genesis Chapter 1 about all that God created. Say, Verse 31 tells us that God saw all He had made, and it was very good. We can look around us at God's creation and say, "It is very good."
- 2. Distribute a pattern page to each child.
- 3. Say the memory verse.
- 4. Tell the children to use the letters in the memory verse to make words that describe things God created. Suggest some ideas for younger children: cats, dogs, trees, ants, stars, toads, goats, and horses.




EXTRA TIME

BEFORE CLASS

Duplicate a pattern page for each child.





WHAT TO DO

- 1. Introduce the lesson by telling the Bible story from Exodus chapters 12 and 13. Have the children look in their Bibles and read Exodus 12:50, 51 aloud together.

 Say, The Israelites did what God told them to do. God wants us all to obey Him.
- 2. Distribute a puzzle page to each child.
- 3. Say the memory verse.
- 4. Say, **Help the Israelites find their way across the Red Sea.** Have the children complete the maze. While the children work on their mazes, discuss some of the ways in which the Israelites obeyed God. Then discuss ways in which we can obey God.



EXTRA TIME

Play "The Lord Commands." Choose one child to be Moses and one to be Aaron. Have the rest of the children stand side-by-side several feet away against one wall of the room. Say, **Moses and Aaron will take turns telling what the Lord commands. You must do what the Lord commands.** However, if they don't say, "The Lord commands!" you shouldn't do that action. Choose others to be Moses and Aaron several times so each child gets a turn at commanding.


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


